## Thanking you in advance to Please SLOW DOWN.

Hedgehog favourite Food

- -Dried kitten biscuits- No fish flavour please (Kitten is easier for hoalets)
- -Spikes semi moist hedgehog food
- -Wet cat food in jelly No fish flavour please
- -Dried mealworms in very small amounts
- -LOTS of water

A 13cm square gap in the bottom of your fence or wall will help hedgehogs to travel around, most will do a mile a night.

And if you see any hedgehogs out during the day, it usually means they are in distress so please seek advise from either Kate or myself within the village. We are helping Jo Pickering from Langtoft who rescues hedgehogs and rehabilitates them ready for release.
