77/25 Public Participation

The Chair invited members of the public to speak.

Mr R Knowles had 3 comments to make, firstly he wished to know which areas of the village the Parish Council paid to have the grass cut and which were the responsibility of ERYC. The Clerk to email the grass cutting map to Cllr S King who will pass a copy on to Mr Knowles. Mr Knowles raised the subject of the grass cutting up at the new cemetery, pointing out that this would need cutting for a considerable length of time so an alternative may be beneficial. Mr Knowles asked if double graves were possible in the new area due to the ground conditions being largely chalk. Cllr S Wells confirmed that double graves would be possible. Finally, Mr Knowles commented on the state of Thwing Hill field. It was confirmed that Mrs P Bolam's rental agreement of the field would come to an end in December and that the terms of the agreement stated the area must be put returned to the state that it was in. It was agreed that the Clerk would write to Mrs Bolam to confirm that this was the case and ask that she sees this is done as the area is now very unsightly.

The electrician was unable to find the connection underground and so couldn't give a precise quote for the work. Cllr T Stansfield agreed to liaise with David Woodcock and the electrician to try to establish the location of the underground connection and acquire a full quote for the necessary work.

It was noted that a gang of youths have been spotted in recent weeks hanging around the area at night. It was requested that the Clerk report the bench to ERYC and ask the local PCSO to monitor the area at night whenever possible.

Cllr S Kirven reported that Fordon Crossroads was still very dangerous to pull out of and
the sign was still not replaced. The Clerk to report this again to ERYC. It was also requested
that the Clerk write to Mr N Rivis to ask him to cut his hedge back which was causing part
of the problem.

 Denby crossroads was also discussed again and it was noted how many accidents have occurred at that junction. It was requested that the Clerk write to both Rudston Parish Council and Kilham Parish Council to ask if they would report the junction to ERYC as would Burton Fleming Parish Council to see if highways will add some road safety measures.
