### A WORD FROM THE EXPERTS!

### SPRING IS COMING AND OUR PRICKLY FRIENDS ARE WAKING UP.

Please take care when clearing up your garden especially if using a Strimmer both frogs and hedgehogs suffer from strimmer accidents. BEFORE YOU CUT - LOOK. If it's long grass cut to a height of 10-12 inches then check what's there before cutting lower. If there is a pile of leaves or brush there may well be a sleeping hedgehog curled up inside, leave alone. Hedgehogs are protected species in the UK, sadly their number are falling and awareness when gardening is essential.

Hedgehogs may need our help to build up their fat reserve lost whilst hibernating so if possible offer water and food. Their preferred food is woodlice and beetles, we can help by offering kitten biscuits or cat/dog poultry food in jelly. Please do not offer bread, milk, peanuts, dry mealworms nor calciworms, they are all dangerous to hedgehogs health and can prove fatal. If buying manufacturers hedgehog food please buy ones that show 30% minimum protein and has very minimal cereal content. If you find hedgehog in trouble or out during the day please do not hesitate to contact your local rescue for advice, delays can cause serious problems for the hog. Rescues will return the hog after treatment if the area is a safe environment.
