## HISTORY GROUP

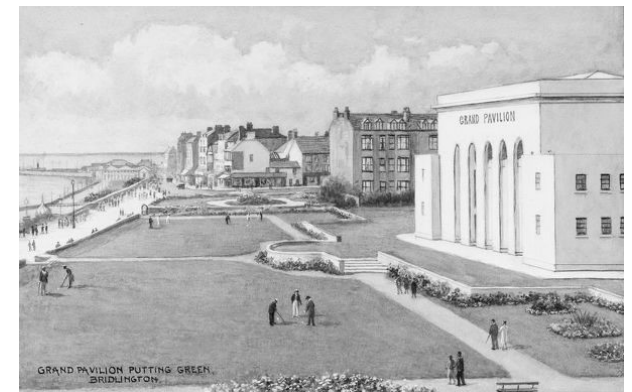
The History Group were presented with a talk by Rick Hudson on Bridlington's lost buildings and entertainment which centred on four particular buildings lost to the town. Three of these buildings, The Peoples Palace, the Victoria Rooms and the Grand Pavilion were each providing entertainment, social events, outdoor activities, concerts and dancing for the town and the many holiday makers who visited. These were very grand buildings but in the 1930s and 40s were all lost to the town through bomb damage, fire and demolition. The fourth building, the Floral Hall, had been built in 1920 mainly out of old aerodrome hangers but only lasted three years as it went up in flames in 1923.

We saw some excellent slides of the town as it used to be and of all these buildings both internal and external. Rick had investigated the history of them to make this a very interesting talk on local history.

Prior to introducing the speaker the secretary reminded everyone that a new secretary and treasurer would be required after April for the Group to continue in its present format. It is hoped that someone will step up and take over,

Our next meeting is on Thursday 21st February when David Mooney relates the history of a sailing ship often seen in Bridlington in the late 1800s, The Lady of Avenel.

Speed Survey

The Parish Council requested a speed traffic survey on both Hunmanby Road and South Street. The results from the Hunmanby Road survey are as follows:

A scoring system is used which determines what level of enforcement is required for a location (0-11 points no further action, 12-15 points temporary Speed Indication devices, 16+ Police enforcement).

A 7 day survey was undertaken on Hunmanby Road at an agreed location between 19 and 25 November 2018 and the results of which have been assessed under the Council's Speed Management Procedure. The total number of vehicles recorded during this period was 6007 which equates to 858 vehicles per day. The total number of vehicles per day exceeding the Police's benchmark for enforcement of 35mph (30mph + 10% + 2mph) was 255 per day which equates to 29.73% of the total traffic. The mean speed recorded was 31.8mph and the 85th percentile speed was 37.7mph. As part of the assessment we also look at the number of recorded injury collisions in the previous 3 year period, in the case of Hunmanby Road it has a good road safety record with no recorded injury collisions.

The speed Management Procedure awarded Hunmanby Road 4 points, which means it does not meet the criteria for Police enforcement or intervention from the Council's Road Safety Team. The reason for the low priority rating is due to low daily volume of traffic, the good road safety record and the majority of the traffic are adhering to the speed limit.

The survey on South Street will be carried out during Spring 2019 and the results will be published in due course.

Dear Friends,
