

<u>Invitation to Participate in</u> Flood Warden Project

East Riding of Yorkshire Council is planning to implement a new initiative. Following the extremely wet winter season last year, the Council has identified several locations that could benefit from the presence of local flood wardens. These wardens would serve as 'eyes on the ground' and act as a reliable source of information for the Council. Your parish has been identified as one of these key areas.

The responsibilities of the flood wardens will include:

- Championing flood resilience within the community.
- Monitoring watercourse levels and reporting when they exceed predetermined trigger points.

Activating flip-down signs to alert motorists of water on the highway when necessary.

The flood wardens' will be provided with comprehensive training and personal protective equipment (PPE) as part of their volunteer role. Further details outlining the role of the flood warden are available upon request from the Clerk. Gyspey Race Annual Inspection

The annual inspection walk of the Gypsey Race took place on Saturday 16th November. There were no major issues but could riparian owners double-check their section as there was some debris and tree saplings which may cause a problem if it flows.

Riparian Ownership

Riparian Owners are reminded of responsibilities. Such their responsibilities include:

- •allowing water to flow through land their without pollution obstruction. diversion which affects the rights of others;
- accepting flood flows through their land even if these are caused by inadequate capacity downstream;
- •keeping the banks clear of anything that could cause an obstruction and increase flood risk, either on their land or downstream if it is washed away;
- maintaining the bed and banks of the watercourse and the trees and shrubs growing on the banks and clearing any litter and animal carcasses from the channel and banks, even if they did not come from their land
