#### Defibrillator

We are pleased to announce that the defibrillator within the telephone kiosk is now live and has been registered with the ambulance service. In the event of an emergency please dial 999 and ask for the ambulance service. You will then be given the code to allow you to access the defibrillator

We will be organising a Defibrillator Familiarisation Session to allow residents the opportunity to learn how the equipment works in case they ever find themselves in an emergency situation. Further details on this will be announced in due course.

### Gypsey Race

Following the recent heavy rainfall, we could expect the Gypsey Race to start flowing. We wish to remind residents that there is a groundwater monitor in place which will provide an early warning system should the water levels rise significantly. This will allow the council time to deploy resources, pumps and sandbags in advance of any major issues.

### Riparian Ownership

Riparian Owners are reminded of their responsibilities. Such responsibilities include:

- allowing water to flow through their land without any obstruction, pollution or diversion which affects the rights of others;
- accepting flood flows through their land, even if these are caused by inadequate capacity downstream;
- keeping the banks clear of anything that could cause an obstruction and increase flood risk, either on their land or downstream if it is washed away;
- maintaining the bed and banks of the watercourse and the trees and shrubs growing on the banks and clearing any litter and animal carcasses from the channel and banks, even if they did not come from their land

Dear Friends
