A very important point is that Flu jabs are still available to all those over 65 years as are children's Flu Nasal Sprays. All carers should have the flu jab if caring for people with long term illnesses and we are told that having the jab does not give you flu.

Please contact the Surgery if you are unable to attend your appointment as in November 24 Doctor's appointments were not attended and 51 appointments made with the Health and Nursing staff were missed. This is a serious problem and very unfair to the Medical staff and to poorly patients waiting to get appointments or attention at the surgery.

Before you see a GP please think about your symptoms and what is important as the 10 minutes allowed for your time with the Doctor is easily taken up with one problem. If you think you need a longer consultation please discuss this with the Receptionist.

Home Visits may be requested if you ring before 10-00am. but can only be made if you are housebound, too ill to come to the surgery or if your medical condition necessitates it and the level of urgency. If the GP refers you to a Community "District" nurse they may also visit you at home

If you are able bodied please utilise the on street parking facilities as the space directly in front of surgery 1 is for disabled **patients only**. There is an issue at the moment with members of the public parking outside the surgery and going shopping in the village..

Please be aware the Surgery closes for lunch from 1-00pm to 1-30pm daily - Thank you


## **Burton Fleming Playground.**



## YOUR PERSONAL BANK ACCOUNT

Imagine that you have a bank account which gives you £86400 every morning when you wake up. Whatever you don't use up during the day gets taken back. Question: what would you do with the money?

Of course you would spend every £ on your own pleasure and that of others whom you love. It was my turn this month to write something for the magazine which some people take in the parish, not many do, so I decided to write something similar for our newsletter.
