Dear Friends,

A question - have you ever been lost.....either as a child or in your car when your Sat Nav wasn't working?

I have, as a child, I was in a shop with my mother when I wandered off to look at the prizes being offered in a local raffle. I so wanted the huge teddy bear that looked at me with such sad eyes. When I eventually looked around for mum, I couldn't find her. I remember how my heart began to pound and my eyes filled up with tears. Suddenly, a hand reached on my shoulder, "Now, where have you been? What have I said about wandering off?" I was so happy to see her and to know I was safe again and was no longer lost.

Jesus tells us, in Luke's gospel, about three times there was a loss.

Firstly, there was the lamb, a little one that had wandered away (just like me). Did the shepherd not bother? No, of course, he went back to try to find it. The second story was about a coin that was lost. A woman had all the coins she had with her, and then found she had lost one, she searched and searched. She didn't give up until she found it. The third story was about a son who really 'lost' himself. He wanted to take all his inheritance and go off and have fun. His father gave him his share and he spent everything. Please drop your note through my door, Church View Cottage.

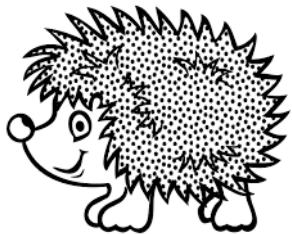
