MESSAGE FROM REV BARBARA

Dear Friends,

We have just spent a day away at Wydale Hall, the York Diocesan Retreat
House. When I say 'WE' I mean folks from the eight churches of our benefice.
It was a great opportunity to spend some quality time together, to listen to two
brilliant and inspiring speakers, to enjoy the lovely food and to share some
different forms of worship. The theme for the day was 'Let your life speak' and
we were encouraged to discuss how our Christian faith impacted on our lives and
how we can speak to others about our faith and encourage others to explore
faith. We are all disciples of Jesus but so often we forget to announce the fact.
Revd Jackie gave us the statement 'I am' and asked us to answer the question. It
was amazing that not one of us said I AM 'a disciple of Christ'. We were lots of
things - parents, workers of different kinds, passionate about certain things
(naturally I said 'Blackburn Rovers). I was ashamed to say that I had taken the
fact that I am a disciple of Christ as read, but I had not announced it.

That made me think about how folks outside the church know that we are
followers of Christ. That statement led me to another. How do we let people
know what we believe and why. I think the best way has to be how we behave to
and with one another.

Jesus' great commandment was and is 'to love one another' and we are given many
opportunities to do this. This made us all think about how we can do this and, of
course, first and foremost we can pray for the members of our villages that are
not church-goers, we can pray for opportunities to help folks - taking them
shopping or for appointments, helping out with some gardening, sitting and
chatting with them..... the list is endless, I'm sure we can all find different ways
to help.

Later on, our other speaker, Alan, spoke to us about 'crisis' and how we deal with
it. He led us into a very interesting and personal time when we had to examine
the crisis' points in our lives and how we grew through these times and what we
learned from them. One thing we did learn was that we are never alone nor are
we left to deal with it all ourselves.

Our Father God sends the Holy Spirit to be with us, we are surrounded with the
Father's love and Jesus Christ, His Son, is with us too, so how can we fail. Please
pray for one another.... that the Holy Spirit will enter the lives of each of us and
bring peace and calm, love and joy and maybe, just maybe, folks may be moved to
find out more about 'being a disciple of Christ'.
