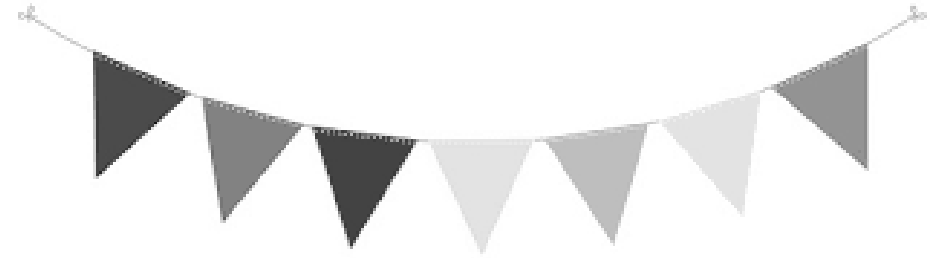

## **VIEW FROM THE VICARAGE**

Dear Friends,

As you will see, this newsletter covers two months so if anything happens of any importance you won't hear about it until September !!

My husband is a great 'list-maker' he makes lists for everything - shopping, holidays, money, all sorts. I remember seeing a film called 'The Bucket List' with Morgan Freeman & Jack Nicholson, a couple of terminally-ill patients who decided to get a car and go and do anything they wanted before passing on to a life of eternity with God. what a great idea.

There are so many things you could put on a list. Spending more quality time with friends and/or family through a monthly meal, or to walk at least 2 miles per day, or to create your own vegetable garden, or to visit that one place you have never been. There are even small things that we can do to create a better environment for example: recycling old shopping bags, buying products with less plastics or packaging, drinking water from a re-usable glass bottle instead of a plastic bottle.

The unlikely partnership between a ruthless businessman and an ordinary motor shop owner in the film, captivated audiences all over the world and I think a lot of us started to think: What would my "bucket list" be like and with whom will I share it? He very instinctively respected women from all walks of life, whether it was a mother in mourning, a bride at a wedding or even a woman who was, perhaps, not of good social standing. Jesus enables us to have a new list to live life to the fullest.
