It's BREEDING and BABY SEASON! Summer is a key breeding period for hedgehogs, with some second litters born late in the summer. Please remember to:

- Check for hogs and hog nests prior to gardening, especially when using strimmers and grass cutters.
- Provide an exit route out of ponds and pools as hogs like to swim.
- Cover holes and drains to prevents hogs from falling in.

If you see any hedgehogs out during the day, it usually means they are in distress, however it could be a nursing mother seeking food or nest materials so please seek advice from either myself Ali (07734053699) or Jo Pickering (East Yorkshire Hedgehog Rescue) from Langtoft (07717552624) who rescues hedgehogs and rehabilitates them ready for release.

Due to extreme weather conditions please could you ensure when feeding hedgehogs you supply LOTS OF WATER!

Hedgehog favourite Food

- Dried kitten biscuits- No fish flavour please (Kitten is easier for hoglets)
- Spikes semi moist hedgehog food
- Wet cat food in jelly No fish flavour please
- Dried mealworms in very small amounts
- LOTS OF WATER!
