ADVICE ON WHAT TO DO WITH A HEDGEHOG IN NEED OF HELP

As well as providing access to roam, here are some other things to do to help hedgehogs;

- Before using a strimmer, make sure the area to cut is clear
- For a couple of days after applying wood preservative at ground level, protect your work from hedgehogs who like to lick it! It makes them very poorly.
 - Stop or reduce the amount of pesticides and poisons used.
 - Move piles of rubbish to a new site before burning them.
 - Ensure netting is kept at a safe height.
 - Check compost heaps before digging a fork in.
 - Cover drains and deep holes.
 - Ensure there is an easy route out of ponds and pools.
- A hedgehog lying in the sun wobbling as it walks or with flies around it needs help. Use a gardening glove to collect it up, bring it indoors in a cardboard box and cover with an old fleece or towel.

Please can you ensure to keep your hedgehog food stations, in and around the village running with plenty of water and food to ensure our hedgehogs have plenty to eat and drink at this busy hoglet time.

Hedgehog favourites:-

-Dried kitten biscuits- No fish flavour please (Kitten is easier for hoglets)
-Spikes semi moist hedgehog food

-Wet cat food in jelly - No fish flavour please -Dried mealworms in very small amounts

Beware of scams

Unfortunately, not everyone out there is trustworthy and some people will try to take advantage of this unusual situation our society is facing and try to exploit people.

Listed below are some of the scams that you could be approached with, but please note that criminals and their scams come in all shapes and sizes, and they may contact you at the door, by phone, post or online:

- Be aware of people offering miracle cures or vaccines for coronavirus there is no specific treatment for coronavirus (COVID-19)
- People impersonating healthcare workers, claiming to be offering 'home-testing' for coronavirus this is a scam and these kits are not currently available to buy
- Emails saying that you can get a refund on taxes, utilities or similar they are usually bogus and they are just trying to obtain your bank and personal details
- Fake products available to buy online that advise they can protect you or cure coronavirus these will not help and are just designed to take your money
- Mobile phone applications that claim to give you updates on the virus but instead, they lock your phone and demand a ransom
- Calls from people purporting to be from your bank, or from the police, asking for your bank details over the phone
 People offering to do you're shopping or collecting medication and asking for money upfront and then disappearing

To avoid becoming a victim of a scam, we've please follow our tips and advice below:

- Be cautious and listen to your instincts. Don't be afraid to hang up, bin it, delete it or shut the door
- 2. Take your time; don't be rushed
- If someone claims to represent a charity, ask them for ID. Be suspicious of requests for money up front. Check with family and friends before accepting offers of helps if you are unsure
- If you are online, be aware of fake news and use trusted sources such as .gov.uk or NHS.uk websites. Make sure you type the addresses in and don't click on links in emails
- 5. Only purchase goods from legitimate retailers and take a moment to think before parting with money or personal information
- 6. Know who you're dealing with if you need help, talk to someone you know or get in touch with your local Council on the numbers advertised
- 7. Protect your financial information, especially from people you don't know. Never give your bank card or PIN to a stranger

Barnabas

Barnabas (born Joseph), was according to tradition an early Christian, one of the prominent Christian disciples in Jerusalem. According to the bible Barnabas was a Cypriot Jew. Named an apostle in Acts 14:14, he and Paul the Apostle undertook missionary journeys together and defended Gentile converts against the Judaizers. They travelled together making more converts and participated in the Council of Jerusalem (c. 50). Barnabas and Paul successfully evangelized among the "God-fearing" Gentiles who attended synagogues in various Hellenized cities of Anatolia.

Barnabas' story appears in the Acts of the Apostles, and Paul mentions him in some of his epistles. Tertullian named him as the author of the Epistle to the Hebrews, but this and other attributions are

conjecture. Clement of Alexandria and some scholars have ascribed the Epistle of Barnabas to him, but his authorship is disputed.

Although the date, place, and circumstances of his death are historically unverifiable, Christian tradition holds that Barnabas was martyred at Salamis, Cyprus, in 61 AD. He is traditionally identified as the founder of the Cypriot Orthodox Church. The feast day of Barnabas is celebrated on June 11.
