### Next Parish Council Meeting

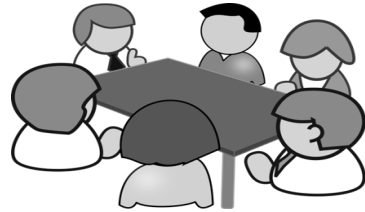
The next Parish Council meeting is to be held on 4th March 2025 at 7.00pm in the Village Hall.

\* Please can you ensure to keep your hedgehog food stations, in and around the village running with plenty of water and food to ensure our hedgehogs have plenty to eat and drink if they should come out of hibernation, this is likely with young hogs and with the changing of weather conditions.

\* These sunny periods are confusing and some hogs may come out of hibernation prematurely. If you need any hedgehog assistance call Ali 0773 405 3699 or Jo 0771 755 2624. If you find a hedgehog that appears unwell or inactive, wrap it in a fleece and contact us immediately.

\* We are in the process of deciding where we will release some of our hogs that have been cared for over the winter. If you have a suitable garden environment and want to commit to providing a feeding station and a hedgehog house, get in touch!
