Lissett Wind Farm Fund

The Lissett Community Wind Farm Fund Panel have allocated an amount of money for the security of homes in the area. The fund has already secured over 200 homes and there are now funds available to secure more.

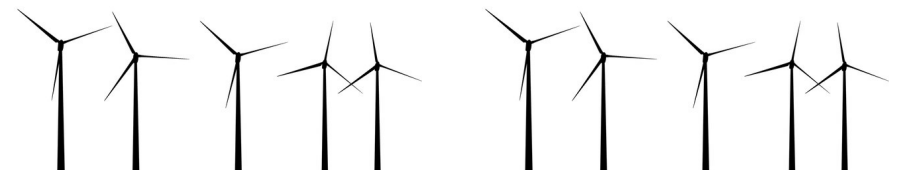
The project aims to reduce burglaries in dwellings and non-dwellings, reduce the risk of re offending, and residents' fear of crime. It will involve carrying out home security assessments and the supply and fitting of home security equipment to dwellings and outbuildings.

HISTORY GROUP

The History Group held their last talk of the present season when Dr. Peter Asquith-Cowans spoke about the " Influence of the Vikings in East Yorkshire".

Peter began by describing the area as it would have been when the Vikings first arrived in this country. They came, not to plunder, but looking for land to settle on. They were slowly and gradually influenced by Christianity and integrated into the already established communities bringing with them new methods of farming and trade.

Many place names today are derived from Viking names and settlements. Many words we use

today are similar to the Norse language. They reorganised areas of the landscape for farming. Travelling in their longboats they brought trade from different lands.

in some instances their shipbuilding techniques are still used today.

The Vikings came to settle and their influences are still with us.

The secretary closed the meeting by thanking everyone for their help and for creating yet another successful season for the Club.

We restart on Thursday 20th September with a talk on historical newspapers. Hope to see you then.

I am pleased to say that there have been hedgehogs seen around the village within the last few weeks and I have released four more that have received bed and breakfast at my house over the winter. We are looking forward to a very exciting spring and summer in Burton Fleming with hopefully lots of hoglet sightings. (Please let Kate or

myself know if you see any hedgehogs around the village so we can monitor their progress and whereabouts.)

Please can you ensure to keep your hedgehog food stations, in and around the village running with plenty of water and food to ensure our hedgehogs have plenty to eat and drink at this busy time of year.

Hedgehog favourites:-

- Dried kitten biscuits- No fish flavour please (Kitten is easier for hoglets)
- Spikes semi moist hedgehog food
- Wet cat food in jelly - No fish flavour please
- Dried mealworms in very small amounts

Ensure your garden has hedgehog doorways to your neighbours and that all ponds have accessible slopes, as the hedgehogs do like to swim.

And if you see any hedgehogs out during the day, it usually means they are in distress so please seek advise from either Kate or myself within the village. We are helping Jo Pickering from Langtoft who rescues hedgehogs and rehabilitates them ready for release.

GREAT NEWS - We have received funding from THE LISSETT WIND FARM FUND and the 4GOODfund, supporting Community projects. Together with funds we have raised over the past 2/3 years we are able to replace

all windows and doors and lay a complete new maple sprung wood floor. The windows and doors, soffits etc have been completed and look great and the new floor will be laid week commencing June 9th. There is a double door onto the Car Park which will enable additional access for outdoor events and marquee extensions. The floor will be completely level and will enable more availability for example for the hiring of dance and sports activities.
