BURTON FLEMING HEDGEHOG NEWS

ADVICE ON WHAT TO DO WITH A HEDGEHOG IN NEED OF HELP

As well as providing access to roam, here are some other things to do to help hedgehogs:

- Before using a strimmer, make sure the area to cut is clear.
- For a couple of days after applying wood preservative at ground level, protect your work from hedgehogs who like to lick it. It makes them very poorly!
- Stop or reduce the amount of pesticides and poisons used.
- Move piles of rubbish to a new site before burning them.
- Ensure netting is kept at a safe height.
- Check compost heaps before digging a fork in.
- Cover drains and deep holes.
- Ensure there is an easy route out of ponds and pools.

A hedgehog lying in the sun, wobbling as it walks or with flies around it needs help. Use a gardening glove to pick it up, bring it indoors in a cardboard box and cover with an old fleece or towel.

Please can you ensure to keep your hedgehog food stations, in and around the village, running with plenty of water and food to ensure our hedgehogs have plenty to eat and drink at this busy time of year prior to hibernation.

Hedgehog favourites:

- Dried kitten biscuits- No fish flavour (Kitten is easier for hoglets)
- Spikes semi-moist hedgehog food
- Wet cat food in jelly - No fish flavour please
- Dried mealworms in very small amounts
