### \*\*BE AWARE - SECURITY ADVICE\*\*

"Humberside police have advised that fraudsters are posing as Yorkshire Water. Victims have either received a scam call or scam text requesting bank details for alleged overdue bills, failed direct debits or to arrange fake visits to your home. To protect yourself, hang up immediately and call Yorkshire Water directly using a trusted number from their official website. You can also set up a unique security password with Yorkshire Water for staff visits.

Darker Nights are now here so a reminder of some basic security advice .

- Secure and lock your doors and windows even when you are in the house. 1
  in 3 burglaries reported to Humberside Police involve entry being gained
  through an open window or an unlocked door, so this easy action could
  reduce the risk of your home being broken into.
- Close your curtains/blinds at night, not only will it assist in keeping your home warm, but it will also prevent people being able to see in and identify items that they may decide to target. When your lights are on at night, it is difficult to see what is happening outside, but those outside can see in quite easily.
- Ensure that any external lights are in good working order. We recommend using dusk to dawn lighting around your home, but lights on PIR sensors that are activated by movement are also suitable. If you currently have no external lights, either of these options could be considered to improve your security.
- Ensure that CCTV cameras are working and there is suitable signage. It has been shown that CCTV in operation signs, used in conjunction with the CCTV do aid to deter criminals from targeting a property. If you are looking at options for CCTV, we recommend considering motion activated cameras that will alert you if movement is detected.
- Consider using smart lights or light timers that will make your home look occupied when you are out. If you are likely to be away for more than a couple of days, please consider setting your lights to come on at different times, or you may unintentionally recreate the scene from 'Home Alone' where the 'burglars' know exactly when your lights are due to come on.
- Please don't leave your car idling on cold or frosty mornings without you in it, as again this provides an opportunity for car thieves.
- Also if you live alone please find a trusted friend or neighbour to keep a spare key for emergencies. Please try not to leave keys in the back of doors when locked, as this can hamper access by a key holder and also provides opportunities for people to try to remove the keys and gain access.

### Non-consecrated Grave Spaces Now Available

The cemetery extension is now ready for burials so anybody wishing to reserve a grave space should complete the application form available on the website www.burtonflemingpc.co.uk or contact the Clerk at clerk@burtonflemingpc.co.uk

It should be noted that the area is not currently consecrated so anybody wishing to be buried, under any faith, will need to organise the necessary blessing at the time of the burial.

The current fees are as listed below; these are reviewed annually in May.

The fees listed below apply to:

- · Parishioners who have been resident in the Parish of Burton Fleming, immediately prior to death
- persons who live in a different Parish but who have previously been a Parishioner in the Parish of Burton Fleming.
- For all non-parishioners, the fees charged will be double those stated below.

### Exclusive Rights of Burial including Interment -Single Grave - £450

• For the exclusive right of burial in an earthen grave not exceeding 7ft x 3ft and depth 6ft 6in and for the interment of a Parishioner

### Exclusive Rights of Burial including Interment - Double Grave - £550

• For the exclusive right of burial in an earthen double grave not exceeding 7ft x 3ft

### Interment in an Existing Grave - £175.00

• For the exclusive right of burial into an existing earthen double grave or cremated remains

### Interment of Cremated Remains

- For the exclusive rights of burial in a grave 2ft  $\times$  2ft for a Parishioner £175.00
- · For interment into existing grave £125.00

### Memorials - £75.00

· A tablet laid horizontally to the ground, including inscription

#### Additional Information

- The fees remain the same for reservation of exclusive rights of burial.
- The fees are double if you wish to take a plot out of rotation
- · The fees do not include the digging of the grave

### SERVICES AT ST CUTHBERT'S CONTINUED.......

I often wondered if my late Mum thought I had a good sense of humour or if she just thought I was a bit annoying. If she asked me a question, I had a habit of answering rather literally whilst ignoring the real (and obvious) question she was asking. For example, I can remember some years ago after a holiday or a day out or something, she asked me if the sun had been shining. My answer was that the sun is always shining, it's just that you can't always see it because the clouds can get in the way. I guess I thought that was mildly amusing, but in reality, it was probably just irritating. 'Clever so and so' she would say.

As well as being slightly annoying, I think that particular example has something of a message for us. The thing is that the sun is always shining, it's just that we can't always see it. That is true literally and I think for Christians it is always true for us metaphorically too. Because of our relationship with God, brought by Jesus on the cross, things for us are always good even if it doesn't always feel like it. Paul writes (in his letter to the Church in Rome) 'We know that all things work together for good for those who love God.' He is not saying that everything is great all the time and that we should live in a state of permanent happiness, but that our faith should affect our attitude when times are hard. Writing to the Church in Thessalonica about what had happened to loved ones who had died, Paul says that 'we grieve, but not as those who have no hope'.

Paul is saying that our hope, our faith, should make a difference to us. To apply a popular saying, Paul might argue that Christians should always be 'glass half full' people, seeing the best in every situation and the best in every person. (Perhaps he would say we should be 'chalice half full' people!) Not that we should be unaware or uncaring about problems around us, not at all, but that we should always be positive knowing that God is with us, caring for us, supporting and strengthening us, that we are not alone and not without hope in whatever situation we face.

So, does this makes sense, and, if so, do you see this in the lives of people in the Church? Are we 'glass half full' people who always see the positives? We can choose to be and perhaps we should choose to be! Think about it., With love.
