Here are some top tips to enjoy the heat without the hazards:

- Never leave your BBQ unattended
- Set it up on a flat surface, away from sheds, trees and shrubs
- Keep children, pets and games well clear
- Have a bucket of water or sand nearby just in case
- Let it cool completely before moving or disposing of it

#### Heading out to the countryside?

Please leave the BBQ at home. Disposable BBQs can cause grass fires, are often left behind as litter and pose a real risk to wildlife.

#### Humberside Police

Three men have been arrested following a series of warrants executed under the Police and Criminal Evidence Act, by officers from our Organised Crime Group and Kinetic Intervention teams at properties in Driffield this morning (Wednesday, 6 August).

Upon entering the addresses, officers discovered and seized quantities of class A drugs, cash and paraphernalia.

An 18-year-old man was arrested at an address on Middle Street South on suspicion of being concerned in the supply of class A drugs, possession of criminal property, and possession of a class B drug.

An 18-year-old man was arrested at an address on St Margarets Close on suspicion of being concerned in the supply of class A drugs.

A 35-year-old man was arrested at an address on The Close on suspicion of possession with intent to supply class A drugs.

All three men remain in police custody while enquiries continue.

We remain committed to tackling drug-related crime and disrupting criminal networks operating in our communities. This afternoon, officers from Driffield Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) supported pupils from North Frodingham Primary School with their Lifestyle Challenge project.

As part of their initiative, the children have chosen to focus on improving road safety by encouraging drivers to reduce their speed through the village.

To raise awareness, a speed monitoring board was positioned at various points around the community. Motorists exceeding the speed limit were stopped by officers and engaged in conversations with both the police and the pupils.

During these interactions, drivers were asked to reflect on the potential consequences of speeding, including how they would feel if their actions caused harm to a child. This personal approach aimed to encourage drivers to consider their responsibilities and the impact of their behaviour on others.

The event not only supported the pupils' project but also highlighted the importance of community and police working together to promote safer roads

Yesterday, officers carried out high-visibility patrols in #Driffield, supported by Simba, a passive drugs detection dog.


As part of the operation, we visited local establishments and several parks in response to community intelligence regarding suspected drug use and supply.

## **Humberside Police launch Community Safety Mounted Volunteers to Tackle Rural Crime**

We are proud to announce the launch of our new Community Safety Mounted Volunteers (CSMV), a dedicated team of horse-riding volunteers. These volunteers will work in partnership with our Rural Task Force and Roads Policing officers to strengthen police visibility, promote community engagement and enhance safety in rural areas across the force. The Humberside Police area offers many unique challenges to policing especially within the East Riding of Yorkshire, containing vast areas of countryside that cannot easily be patrolled by car but are too large-an-area to cover on foot.

The CSMV team currently comprise of 10 trained riders, with the focus to patrol hard-to-reach areas by covering rural routes around the East Riding that may not be seen as often by patrolling officers. Their aims are to deter crime and report incidents of rural and wildlife crime, antisocial behaviour and fly tipping.

Using their regular riding routes, volunteers act as the eyes and ears of the police, offering a vital link between law enforcement and the rural community. Their elevated vantage point and ability to cover large distances make them an invaluable asset in

identifying suspicious activity and promoting community safety.

#### Theft of Chickens

Police received a report on 23rd August 2025 of theft of chickens from allotments in Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire.

Police commenced an investigation in relation to the theft of approx 85 - 150 chickens stolen from an allotment. Between 2000 hrs on Friday 22nd August 2025 and the morning of Saturday 23rd August 2025, Person or persons unknown have approached the allotment from fields behind the allotment, and then approached pens inside the allotment and stolen chickens from within the allotment and from two small sheds that were also broken into causing damage. Three bags of seed were also stolen from the shed. The offenders have then made off across the field.

The Suspect vehicle is believed to be a Landrover Freelander 2 post 2009 model. VRM unknown. Male suspect is described as late 40's, white, skinhead, heavy build, no facial hair - he was driving a land rover freelander 2 in dark blue. No trailer.

So approximately £2745 worth of birds and £70 worth of feed. Around £100 worth of damage in total.

Following this on Monday 25th August 2025 between 1615 hrs and 1940 hrs around 16 chickens were located dumped in a lay- by close to Dowthorpe Hall, Skirlaugh. 6 were dead and 11 alive.

Police are appealing for any witnesses to the theft and the subsequent potential sightings of the vehicle involved in the theft and dumping of the stolen chickens. Police are also appealing for anyone that has any CCTV, ring doorbell footage or dashcam footage that may assist Police with their enquiries to get in touch on 101. The vehicle may be missing a nearside lower door trim that it left at the crime scene.

#### **Crime Prevention**

I wanted to provide you with an update regarding House burglary, which people around your area have highlighted as an issue of concern on the priority survey.

A burglary occurred recently on Bempton Drive, Bridlington. Please be vigilant.

Although you may not live in this area please be advised that most burglars are not master criminals - they are opportunists. In nearly a third of all burglaries the residents had left a window or door open when they went out. With the hot weather we are currently enjoying please remember and close your windows.

Burglary is a particularly invasive crime that can have a lasting impact on victims. If you have been a victim and need support and help, you should have been offered the services of Victim Support. You may have declined at the time, or not noticed the offer, but can refer yourself at any time by either calling 0808 168 9111 or visiting their website www.victimsupport.org.uk.

Burglars do not want to get caught, so taking action to make your home or business premises safe and less attractive to thieves can go a long way to reducing the risk.

Not all advice, or security products recommended are the same, or necessarily fit for purpose.

#### Summer Holidays and Social Media

Although we are getting towards the end of the summer holidays, there are still plenty of people going on holiday.

I often see people posting on social media that they are going on holiday with comments such as "See you in 2 weeks" and a picture at the airport.

Before posting this type of thing, please consider that you are in effect informing people that your house is likely to be empty for that period.

Once people start liking and commenting on the post, their friends or followers may then see that you are on holiday as well, which could be an alarmingly large number of people, and could then include someone who would like to pay your house a visit whilst you aren't there.

Insurance companies do also check social media if it is relevant to a claim, so if whilst on holiday your house gets broken into, and you claim off your insurance, they will likely check your social media for anything to suggest you advertised that your home was empty and ultimately may not pay out on the claim.

It is understandable that you may wish to show people that you have had a good time, but please consider waiting until you return from your holiday before doing so.

#### What is Secured by Design and how can it assist you.

There is a search section that allows you to identify a product, you will then be given a list of companies that manufacture these products, with links to their websites. This can be located here.

You can also search member companies using a search facility, once selected you will see a list of the approved products that company produces. This can be located here.

There is an area where design guides can be viewed for a variety of buildings, showing suggested security for different areas of the buildings. This can be located here.

#### **OPERATION COAST LINE**

Operation Coastline is an initiative aimed to target antisocial behaviour and criminality in coastal areas and market towns across Humberside, whilst this operation involves many teams all around the force, today we are shining a light on the hard work by our Roads Policing Unit.

Over the weekend officers from our Roads Policing team worked around the clock conducting intensified patrols in coastal areas, alongside roadside checks and proactively stopping vehicles linked to antisocial use of motor vehicles.

Neighbourhood Police Inspector Pete Musgrave said "We have seen an increase in reports of antisocial use of the roads and understand that this is a pressing issue for the community.

"To tackle this issue our roads policing team have been out taking positive action and engaging with drivers, they have already seen promising results that are making a real difference to our local communities"

In just 48 hours Roads Policing officers issued 18 notices of intended prosecution for driving without due care and attention, completed six traffic offence reports and handed out four Section 59 warnings for antisocial vehicle use.

This is just one of the many preplanned operations that our Roads Policing Unit participate in in a bid to keep the public safer on the roads of East Yorkshire, North Lincolnshire and North East Lincolnshire.

#### HERBERT PROTOCOL

If someone you care for—especially someone living with dementia or memory loss—were to go missing, would you be ready to help the police act fast?

The Herbert Protocol is a national safeguarding initiative that helps police locate vulnerable missing persons more quickly. It involves filling out a form with key details such as:

- A recent photo
- Medical conditions
- Places of significance
- Daily routines
- Contact information

Filing the form takes around 20 minutes to complete—about the same time as:

- Making a cup of tea and watching the news
- A short walk around the block
- Catching up on emails or scrolling social media This small investment of time could make a life-saving difference.

If a person goes missing, the completed form can be handed to police immediately, helping them act faster and more effectively. The Herbert Protocol has already helped reunite families and save lives.

## **Chimney Fire Safety Week 2025**

While there may still be warm days ahead, now is the ideal time to start preparing your chimney before colder weather sets in. Chimney Fire Safety Week 2025 serves as a timely reminder to protect your home by making sure your chimney is clean, safe and ready for use.

#### Why do chimney fires happen?

Chimney fires are usually caused by high temperatures or flames from a hot fire igniting built-up soot or creosote inside the flue. These deposits are highly flammable and can lead to serious damage if left unchecked.

Why chimney sweeping is essential

Regular sweeping removes soot, creosote, bird nests, cobwebs and other blockages that can obstruct airflow or catch fire. It also helps maintain appliance efficiency and prevents dangerous fumes from entering your home.

#### What you should do:

- Have your chimney swept regularly by a certified professional
- Clear bird nests and overgrown plants around the chimney externally
- Keep chimneys and flues well-maintained and inspected
- Use a fire guard with open fires
- Fully extinguish fires before leaving the house or going to bed
- Only burn good quality fuel
- Ensure vents and air bricks are not blocked

#### How often should you sweep your chimney?

This depends on the type of fuel you use:

- Smokeless fuels: at least once a year
- Bituminous coal: at least twice a year
- Wood: quarterly when in use
- Oil: once a year
- Gas: once a year (only by a Gas Safe registered engineer)

#### Homeowners and renters:

If you use a chimney or flue, it's your responsibility to make sure it is properly maintained. Your home insurance may specify required sweeping frequency, especially for thatched or heritage properties.

#### Landlords:

You have a legal duty to maintain room heaters and water heating systems, including chimneys and flues, for your tenants.

#### After a chimney fire

If a chimney fire occurs, have a certified sweep inspect the chimney before using it again. Structural damage or flue instability may not be immediately visible.




